## Main Message:

## Lesson:

We have a variety of materials sitting in our kitchen drawers: plastic, metal, silicone to name a few. Why do we all still have wooden spoons? Isn't one of our favorite sayings, "Out with the old and in with the new"? The wooden spoon can be dated back to the Iron Age Celts around 250 BC. That is old! Surely, this is an out dated relic; one that should be thrown out by any self-respecting, modern day cook.

However, before you race to the garbage can, consider the qualities of the wooden spoon. From the beginning it was a popular utensil because it was easy to carve and not very costly.
