

SCRIPTURE:

MAIN MESSAGE:

We must remember the seriousness of sin and the fact that God hates sin.

LESSON:

When I think back to why God created some of the animals that He did, the wasp species is one that really baffles my mind. No doubt, God knows far more and better than I, so I will simply sit back and continue to run away from these flying enemies like a little girl.

Did you know that God hates sin? No, I mean He really hates sin. The Scriptures say, "There are six things which the Lord hates, Yes, seven which are an abomination to Him:" (Proverbs 6: 16).
